

Boulder Precinct No. 13: Beginning on NW corner of Tp. 32 N., R. 109 W. and running thence E to the SE corner of Sec. 33, 33-108: thence N to Fall Creek: thence northeasterly with the meanders of Fall Creek to the NW corner of Tp. 33 N., R. 107 W: thence E along the Tp. lines to the County Boundary; thence following the County boundary to a point due E of the NW corner of Sec. 27, 32-107; thence W to said corner; thence S five miles; thence East three miles; thence S along the Range line to the SE corner of Tp. 29 N., R. 107 W; thence W along Tp. lines to the SW corner of Tp. 29 N., R. 109 W; thence N to point of beginning.

East Fork Precinct No. 14: Beginning on NW corner of Sec. 27; 32-107 W; and running thence E to the County line; thence following the County line S and W to the SW corner of Tp. 27 N., R. 108 W; thence N to the NW corner of Tp. 28 N., R. 108; thence E to the SW corner of Tp. 29 N., R. 106 W; thence N to the NE corner of Sec. 24, 31-107; thence W three miles; thence N five miles to point of beginning.

The County was divided into five election districts as follows:

District No. 1, embracing Pinedale polling Precinct No. 1;

District No. 2, embracing Big Piney polling Precinct No. 2;

District No. 3, composed of the following Polling Precincts; Bondurant-No. 3; Kendall-No. 4; Bronx-No. 5; Cora-No. 6; Merna-No. 7; and Daniel-No. 8;

Election District No. 4, composed of the following Polling Precincts; Halfway-No. 10; Piney-No. 11; Calpet-No. 12;

Election District No. 5, composed of the following Polling Precincts: Pine Creek-No. 9; Boulder-No. 13; and East Fork-No. 14:

The Justice and Constable Districts were reduced to two: Pinedale Justice and Constable District No. 1, to include election districts Nos. 1, 3, and 5; and Big Piney Justice and Constable District No. 2, to embrace the territory included in election districts Nos. 2 and 4.
