OFFICIAL COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS

Pinedale, Wyoming  
February 1, 1966

The Board met in regular session on this date with all members present.

The minutes of the previous meeting was approved as read.

The reports of the various county officials were approved and ordered filed.

Justice of the Peace District No. 4 was combined with Justice of the Peace District No. 2.

J.S. Wixom having resigned as Justice of the Peace for District No. 2, Frank Yearsley was appointed to fill his unexpired term.

Hours of Liquor Sale designated by the license issuing bodies of the county are the following Sundays to be open: July 3, July 10, July 24, and September 4.

Retail Beverage Permit No. 192 was granted to Sublette County Sporting Assn. for February 5th and 6th.

The Bond of Paul C. Hagenstein, Treasurer Sublette County Fair Board, \$2000.00 was approved. Having been moved, seconded and carried, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Sublette is desirous of taking advantage of the provision of Chapter 136, Session Laws of Wyoming, 1961, by cooperating with the State Highway Commission of Wyoming in the improvement of a county road, the location and extent of which is as follows: From the end of FAS 3 (1) 1039 in the NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of the SW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of Section 34, T.27N., R.113W., of the 6th P.M., Wyoming, thence northerly thru sections 34, 27, 22, 16, 9, 8, 5 and 4 T., 27N., R.113W., thence northerly thru sections 32, 33, 28, 29 and 20, T.28N., R.113W., to a connection with SC-CFM 23-1, in Section 20, T.28N., R.113W., of the 6th P.M., Wyoming.

Length approximately 9.0 miles.

Grading, draining, surfacing, oil mat and miscellaneous work.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY SAID BOARD:

That the Board enter into a written agreement with said Commission covering said improvement in accordance with a contract therefore, now submitted to said Board by said Commission, which agreement is hereby approved and ordered filed in the office of the County Clerk of said county; that the Chairman of said Board and the County Clerk of said County be, and they are hereby authorized and direct to execute said contract on behalf of said Board.

On July 6, 1965 a petition, signed by Francis M. Tanner and others was presented to the Board of County Commissioners, requesting them to establish a Special Cemetery District, having a common and identical boundary with the Southwest School District.

On September 17, 1965 a public hearing was held in Big Piney to hear all matters affecting the creation of such a district.

No protests to the creation of the district were filed.

December 7, 1965 an election was held in Big Piney upon the question of the organization and establishment of the Special Cemetery District. Property owners vote for establishment of the district was 58 votes. Non-property owners for the establishment of the district was 12 votes. Property owners vote against the establishment of the district was 2 votes. Non-Property owners vote against the establishment of the district was 1 vote.

The Special Cemetery District was established.

On January 14, 1966 an election was held in Big Piney for the purpose of electing trustees for the Cemetery District. Dan Chapel, Dan H. Budd and Mildred Miller were elected trustees for the Short Term ending Nov 98, 1966. Jim Luce, Robert O'Neil and James Mickelson were elected trustees for the Long Term ending November 5, 1968.
