

Official County Commissioners Proceedings, continued

May 2, 1972

Thence North 7 miles to a point;

Thence west 9 miles to a point;

Thence north to the northeast corner of Section 16,  
Township 34 North, Range 113 West of the 6th P.M.;

Thence west 13 miles to the west boundary of Sublette County,  
the terminal point thereof;

respectfully petitioning that this area, as described above, situate in Sublette County be established as a Special Cemetery District.

Jake Pfisterer made motion that the County Clerk initiate procedure to set up the Special Cemetery District, Mike Marincic Second, Motion Carried.

Donald Wassenberg and Lillian C. Allen presented evidence that several lots in the Town of Marbleton had been omitted from an original Tax Deed, and since taxes had been paid on these lots thru the years, requested a Quit Claim Deed from the County Commissioners on said lots. Upon the advice of our County Attorney, John S. Mackey, Jake Pfisterer moved a Quit Claim Deed be presented from the Board of County Commissioners to the Green River Development Company, a Wyoming Corporation on:

Lots 20 and 21, Block 27; Lots 23 and 24, Block 26; Lots 17 and 18, Block 25;  
and Lot 1, Block 33, all in the Original Townsite of Marbleton.

Mike Marincic second and motion unanimously carried.

The bids on the new County Pickup were opened and read aloud. Michael Marincic moved, Jake Pfisterer second, we Buy the 1972 3/4 Ton 4 Wheel Drive Pickup from Anderson-Penton Chevrolet Company for the bid price of \$3,900.00. The other bid was received from Worl's Ford Service.

Lawrence McKinsey asked about the possibility of getting work done on the lower end of the Boulder North Road, and was informed that as quickly as the Easements were signed and presented, the County would do what they could to improve this road.

Abner Hecox discussed the restrictions that the Planning and Zoning Commission requested him to have on the Gypsum Creek #2 Plat and various other requests. After much discussion Michael Marincic moved we accept Gypsum Creek Subdivision No. 2 Plat for County Records. Jake Pfisterer Seconded. Motion Carried.

Crowell Dean question on Subdivision Resolution was answered by stating that there will be another hearing on this before it is accepted.

Richard Tanner reported that he might be moving to Kemmerer and what is the procedure for appointment of a new Coroner. His questions were answered and assured the proper action would be taken.

Jack Richardson and Robert A. Harrower, Jr., were in to present the plans for the zone change Mr. Richardson was requesting and they were assured the proper action would be instituted.

Bob Sneedler asked about the Industrial Site development and he was assured that the County Commissioners would see that something was done immediately to get the Site platted.

Disposal of Solid Waste Materials came under much discussion with the Big Piney Town Council Members, Ted Hiner, Bob Tracy and Red Wilkerson, and a meeting was discussed with Paul Hagenstein to look into this matter.

John S. Mackey, County Attorney, Donald Wassenberg, R. S. Bennett, Jr., and the County Commissioners discussed delinquent taxes and redemption of properties. Jake Pfisterer moved, Michael Marincic Seconded, the County Commissioners accept all of the money due on delinquent taxes and issue R. S. Bennett, Jr., a Quit Claim Deed for the property involved.

Harold Faler was re-appointed to the Sublette County Museum Board for a term of three years. Said term expires June 1, 1975. Michael Marincic so moved, Jake Pfisterer second and motion carried.

Call for Bids on Jake Pfisterer motion, seconded by Michael Marincic, the following "Call for Bids" was adopted:

1. Tires to be supplied to the Road and Bridge and Sheriff's Departments as required.
2. Premium gasoline and diesel fuel delivered to the vehicles of the County Sheriff and the Road and Bridge Departments from the service station pumps in Big Piney, Wyoming.
3. Regular gasoline and diesel fuel delivered to the Road and Bridge Shop Building four miles east of Pinedale.
4. Premium and regular gasoline delivered to the vehicles of the County Sheriff's department from the service station pumps at Pinedale, Wyoming.
5. Regular Gas and #2 Diesel delivered from pumps for the Road and Bridge Department at the Town of Big Piney.

Michael Marincic made motion the following resolution be adopted. Jake Pfisterer seconded and motion carried:

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners of Sublette County, Wyoming deem the public interest requires that a road be established to be known as the Bondurant Cemetery County Road No. 23-183 described as follows:

Beginning at Station 0+00, S89°-50'W, 1604.4 feet from the east one-quarter corner of Section 33, T.38N., R.113W., 6th P.M.

Thence running Southwesterly through the followings:
