Having been properly advertised, the Public Hearing on the County Budgets was called to order by 8:00 o'clock P.M. by Michael Marincic, Chairman, with all members present, the County Clerk, the County Assesor, the County Sheriff and the County Agent and the Home Demonstration Agent.

The Agricultural Budget was discussed, and only increase allowed was on the Maintenance and Repair of Equipment.

The County Assessor, Hazel Werner, discussed the raise in our Advalorem Tax structure and fully explained the raise in valuation. The Assessor's Budget was examined and more money put into the Supplies and Stationery Fund.

Fair Board Budget was looked at and no changes made. All Budgets were quickly reviewed and changes made only in the Miscellaneous General Budget to have sufficient matching funds for the Detoxification and Alcoholic Rehabilitation Center if it was adopted.

On a Jake Pfisterer motion and a Paul Hagenstein second the Appropriation Resolution and the Resolution to Provide Income necessary to Finance Budget were unanimously passed.

APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on the 15th day of June, 1974 the budget making authority, prepared and submitted to the Board a county budget for the 74-75 fiscal year ending June 30, 1975.

WHEREAS, such a budget was duly entered at large upon the records of this Board and a copy thereof was made available for public inspection at the office of the County Clerk; and

WHEREAS, notice of a public hearing on such budget, together with the summary of said budget, was published in the Pinedale Roundup a legal newspaper published and of general circulation in the county on the 18th day of July, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on such budget at the time and place specified in said notice, at which time all interested parties were given an opportunity to be heard; and

WHEREAS, following such public hearing certain alterations and revisions were made in such proposed budget, all of which more fully appear in the minutes of this Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners that the county budget, as so revised and altered, be adopted as the official county budget for the fiscal year ending June 30,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the following appropriations be made for the 1974 1975 fiscal year ending June 30, 1975 and that the expenditures of each officer, department or spending agency be limited to the amount herein appropriated.
