

OFFICIAL COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDING'S

Pinedale, Wyoming
March 1, 1983

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session with all members present. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Chairman, Floyd E. Bousman and minutes of the last meeting were approved as written on motion by Louie Tomassi. Motion seconded by Gordon Johnston and carried.

Surety Bonds of Peter Arambel, Secretary-treasurer of the Sublette County Predatory Animal Board, \$1000. and of Alice Griggs, Clerk-Treasurer of the Town of Marbleton, \$1000.00 were approved and filed with the County Treasurer.

Dr's. Joseph Golden and Helene Bakewell related that a state appraisal of mental health services, provided to Sublette, Lincoln and Teton Counties, by Western Wyoming Mental Health Association was requested by State Senator John Turner and Representative H. L. Jensen-Teton County, due to alledged inner conflicts and frustrations between the board and the programs director-mainly in Teton County and possibly in the other two counties. Dr. Golden stated that the state is charged with selecting the most appropriate provider of mental health services and their contract with Western Wyoming Mental Health Association to provide these services in the tri-county area will expire in June. The Jackson Hole Counseling Service has unofficially indicated willingness to provide these services and he and Dr. Bakewell have been appointed by the Wyoming Department of Health and Social Services to evaluate the Western Wyoming Mental Health Association and to deliver a report to each board of county commissioners upon completion.

Ranchers, Verla Sommers, Charles Price, Les Wilcox and Mike Miller requested county repairs on the bridge over the Green River on the Sommers County Road No. 23-146. They stated that this is the only feasible crossing in the area and provides needed access for their ranching operations. The commissioners were reluctant to finance a project which benefits so few people at the present time and the ranchers agreed to help cut costs and man hours by providing the labor to tear off the old decking and also lay the new decking. Commissioner Tomassi moved that the county rebuild the bridge. Motion seconded by Commissioner Johnston. Motion passed.

On motion by Commissioner Johnston, seconded by Commissioner Tomassi, motion carried, the following resolutions were adopted:

RESOLUTION NO. 83-14B

A RESOLUTION CREATING A SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL DISTRICT, GRANTING GOVERNING BOARD AUTHORITY TO MAKE RULES AND REGULATIONS, PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY UPON CONVICTION.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Sublette County, Wyoming, deem it necessary in promotion of health, safety and welfare of county inhabitants to create a county-wide solid waste disposal district.

WHEREAS, it was determined that such district should include unincorporated lands within the county, including all municipalities who desire to participate, and that it should be created and operated in conformity with the provisions of Section 18-11-102, W.S., 1977.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SUBLTE COUNTY, WYOMING:

Section 1. A solid waste disposal district is hereby created and established, which shall be composed of all unincorporated lands contained within the county.

Section 2. The boundary of the district may, from time to time, be increased to include any municipality, provided that the governing body of the municipality shall furnish the Board of County Commissioners with a copy of a resolution wherein it signifies a willingness to be included. Such municipality shall be included in the district, and if it withdraws or is otherwise released, the effective dates of the withdrawal or release shall be at the end of the year during which such municipal property has been included in the tax assessment which funds the district.

Section 3. The governing board of the district shall consist of five (5) members, who may serve a maximum term of three (3) consecutive years, and may be reappointed for one additional three (3) year term. Terms shall be staggered.

Section 4. The members of the governing body for the first term shall be those persons hereafter named, and they shall serve for the term specified beside each name, and subsequent appointments shall be accomplished by resolution:

Darrell Walker - 3 year term ending March 1, 1986.
Gary Eiden - 2 year term ending March 1, 1985
Hammer Reed - 2 year term ending March 1, 1985
Caron Griffith - 1 year term ending March 1, 1984
Rhonda Griggs - 1 year term ending March 1, 1984

Section 5. Should a vacancy occur on the board, the remaining members shall submit one or more names to the Board of County Commissioners with its recommendations, and the latter shall consider the advice and recommendation of the governing board, but shall not be bound to make any appointments from the names submitted. If the Board of County Commissioners fails by its first regular monthly meeting following the date the governing body of the solid waste disposal board has submitted its recommendations, the Board of County Commissioners may make any necessary appointment, or, if it fails to do so, a majority of the remaining members shall constitute a quorum in regard to the conducting of the business of the district.

Section 6. The governing body of the district may exercise all powers granted to cities and towns, and shall adopt such rules and regulations in managing the disposal of solid wastes within the district as it deems necessary.

Section 7. A violation of any rule or regulation properly adopted by the governing body shall constitute a low misdemeanor, and any person convicted thereof may be fined not more than \$100.00 or may be imprisoned not exceeding six (6) months, or both.

Section 8. The governing body may also enforce its rules and regulations by appropriate legal proceedings and expend and generate revenue relative to the purpose of a solid waste district.
