OFFICIAL COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS

Pinedale, Wyoming
 January 8, 1985

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session this date with members Floyd Bousman, Gordon Johnston and Louie Tomassi and County Clerk Lois Yake present.

Chairman Bousman called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. and nominated Gordon Johnston to serve as chairman for the next two years. Commissioner Tomassi supported the nomination which was accepted by Commissioner Johnston.

Minutes of the preceding regular meeting were read. There being no alterations or additions the minutes were accepted and filed as read.

Ed Phillips of Modular Detention Facilities presented drawings showing three alternate plans for expanding the county jail to accommodate an additional eight, twelve or fourteen prisoners. Estimated costs ranged between one hundred seventy-five and two hundred thirty eight thousand dollars. The commissioners thanked him for providing the information but determine how the project will be financed before calling for bid proposals.

County Court Justices Betty Fear and Bill Cramer and Attorneys Gerald Mason and Bill Twitchell were present to offer input on the county commissioners recent resolution to establish a county court system in Sublette County. If established the county court system would supplant and replace the present justice court system and be funded by the state with the exception of facilities which would be provided by the county. The commissioners referred to a prefilled bill which, if passed by the legislature, could require Sublette County to join one or more counties under a circuit court system and expressed a belief the Sublette County would be better off having its own separate county court system. During a phone call from Senator John Turner (Sublette-Teton) the commissioners asked that he proceed with his offer to appear before the Senate Appropriations Committee tomorrow morning to request funding for the county court system and they will call him within a few days if they decide to have the request withdrawn. If the legislature appropriates the funding the county court system would become effective July 1, 1985 and the first year cost to the state would be \$156.00.

Having received nomination petitions equal to the number of appointments to be made the commissioners appointed Edward F. Steele, Jr., Jay McGinnis and Wayne Jensen to four year terms as members of the Weed and Pest Control Board of Directors.

County Sanitarian Bert Reinow expressed his concern for potential contamination of underground aquafiers as a result of waste water reinjection wells at Exxon's dehydration sites. At his request State Oil and Gas Conservation Commission staff members Mel James, Mark Watson and Gene Robbins and Bureau of Land Management personnel Gary Bowers, Chris Butler and Tom Curry were present to explain methods used to protect these fresh water resources. Exxon will be required to dispose of the waste water in accordance with state and federal rules and regulations.

Jim Greenwood was granted a right-of-way easement across county-owned land to provide access to property near Cora.

The county commissioners and town mayors Bill Hout, Dick Holgate and Garry Eiden reached an agreement on future operation of sanitary landfills. Presently Pinedale and Big Piney each operate a town landfill and for the past several years the county has provided the equipment and operator to dig the pits when needed. The county will now be responsible for the operation and maintenance of all landfills and will charge a user fee on a per load basis and hire personnel to man each site during open hours. A new landfill in the Big Piney/ Marbleton area is expected to be available for public use sometime this summer and plans for a new site near Pinedale are well under way. The county commissioners will establish a schedule of user fees and open hours and plan to adopt the new system in early February.
