

Joe Hicks said he saw Joe Feltner 2 or 3 years ago and was told that the present road was a County Road. That a resolution was adopted.

Fritch said the forest service had thoroughly researched the records and could not find a resolution nor was the plat recorded. The County does not have a legal right of way under Wyoming Statutes.

Questions were raised regarding a right of way which was returned to the Nobles. Jim Noble stated that the Commissioners returned the right of way because the Forest Service did not have their share of the funding for the new road. That right of way was nearly the same as the proposed Noble route.

Homeowners in the BLM small tracts were concerned about who would provide access to their property if the north route was chosen. Fritch said the Forest Service would allow access but would not build the road. Some homeowners said they were not told that there was not legal access to their property. Swirczynski stated that he knew there was not legal access across the Noble land. He thought the County should pick the shortest and cheapest route.

Ruth Noble said the Noble route would reduce stress placed on the New fork Lake dam by traffic to the Boy Scout Camp. Jim Noble confirmed that the majority of the traffic going into New fork Lakes goes to the Boy Scout Camp and beach area. The new route would bypass the dam.

The Commissioners determined that they would accept the Noble Route. The remaining question is to decide whether to go north of the BLM small tracts or through them.

DeLon Potter, BLM area manager, stated that he believes the remaining unsold small tracts and the adjacent 40 acres will be listed for exchange. The Board asked about a trade with Noble for additional land to the north of the small tracts. Noble stated that he is still interested in a land exchange. Potter and Harper said that due to a court case the BLM is involved in the timing of a land exchange is unpredictable.

Swirczynski suggested that the possibility of a three way exchange (BLM, state and Noble) be pursued. It was decided that Harper would investigate this and have an answer for the October 7th meeting of the Board.
