The establishment of Free Dump Days at the County Landfills was discussed with April 25 & 26 and May 2 & 3 as possible dates, depending on the Towns of Big Piney and Marbleton. The May dates were requested by the Town of Pinedale.

Clifton Vaughn of Caring For Others presented information about his program which provides counseling services on alcohol and drug awareness. The information included a proposal for providing counseling services in the County for \$2,500. The Commissioners informed Vaughn that they would review the proposal, but before accepting it, they would require endorsement from Steve Zimmerman of the Division of Community Programs, State Department of Health and Social Services.

Janet Montgomery discussed the bridge required on the New Fork Lake Road. It was decided to advertise for bids with the bid opening to be held at the May 5, 1987 meeting. The Farm Loan Board will require a letter justifying the bridge and a letter from the Wyoming Highway Department approving the bridge before the grant money awarded will be released.

Eric Lison, Sharon Flasche, and Karen Darrow, representing SAFV, presented the SAFV program's recent on-site evaluation conducted by the State Department of Health and Social Services and discussed budget.

Dana Stone, District Forester, presented the 1987 Wildland Fire Control Annual Operating Plan which was discussed and signed by the Commissioners.

June Wassenberg, representing the Joint Powers Board for the Big Piney-Marbleton Fire Departments, discussed the South Lincoln County Fire Protection District Proposed Mutual Aid Agreement which was referred to the Joint Powers Board and Fire Departments for review and recommendations to be presented at the April 21st meeting. Wassenberg indicated that bids for the proposed fore hall will be accepted by May. A proposed budget was presented for review.

Bill Bloom, County Undersheriff, presented bids for roof repairs on the Marbleton office. Bloom was directed to rebid the roof and provide the specifications to prospective-bidders. Bids will be opened on April 21st.

The revised agreement on the New Fork Lake Road from the Wyoming Highway Department was signed.

In accordance with the notice published in the Pinedale Roundup on March 26, 1987, public hearing was held for the transfer of funds in the amounts of \$2,000 from the General Fund and \$2,000 from Cash Reserve to the County Surveyor and Elections budgets, respectively. There being no objections, it was moved by Commissioner Bousman and seconded by Commissioner Skinner to transfer the funds. Motion carried.

Three representatives from the local BLM office made a formal presentation on the draft environmental impact statement for the Pinedale Area Resource Management Plan.

Chuck Jones, new local Forest Service supervisor, introduced himself to the Commissioners and expressed his desire to work with them when he officially starts in June.

Greg Anderson and Jerry Hermansen, representing the Daniel Fire Department, discussed the prices obtained on a chase truck. They were directed to further investigate the purchase with the possibility of a cheaper price.

Bob McFarland and Jane Warinner, representing the Museum Board, presented a budget request and discussed next year's funding.

The County Clerk was directed to send letters of support for the installation of a Super-Collider in Sublette County to Governor Mike Sullivan, Senator Malcolm Wallop, Senator Alan K. Simpson, and Representative Dick Cheney.

Placement of the telephone line on the Fayette-Pole Creek road and the power line on Orcutt Hill were discussed.

Ellen Toth, Director of the Retirement Center, discussed the Center's Farm Loan Board application and ways to possibly reduce the present payment on the current loan. Toth was encouraged to pursue the alternatives discussed.
