OFFICIAL COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS DECEMBER 15, 1987

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on this date at 9 a.m. with Louie Tomassi, Floyd Bousman, Monte Skinner, Ric Samulski, Todd Adams, Mike McGinnis, and Mary Lankford, County Clerk present.

The minutes of the preceding regular meeting of December 1, 1987, were approved and ordered filed on motion by Commissioner Bousman and seconded by Commissioner Skinner. The motion carried.

The official bond for Mildred M. Miller, Big Piney Cemetery District Treasurer, in the amount of \$1,000 was approved and ordered filed with the County Treasurer.

The Board directed the County Clerk to notify Paul Scherbel, County Surveyor, concerning representing Sublette County's application to the Farm Loan Board to replace the New Fork River Bridge.

Ellen Toth, Director of the Sublette County Retirement Center, presented a lease agreement between Sublette County and the Sublette County Retirement Center for the Phase II portion of the building. The agreement was approved and signed.

Dana Stone, State Forester, discussed the poor condition of the bridge at the Little Sandy. The Board directed Mike McGinnis to inspect the bridge with Stone and estimate the cost of the repairs. A contract between the State and County was discussed with actual cost of repairs being reimbursed to the County.

It was moved by Commissioner Bousman and seconded by Commissioner Skinner to approve the application prepared by Nelson Engineering for the change of use permit on the Marbleton Landfill. The motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Bousman and seconded by Commissioner Skinner to approve and sign a BLM right of way for the Skyline Drive tree project. The motion carried.

June Wassenberg, representative of the Joint Big Piney-Marbleton Volunteer Fire Department, thanked the Commissioners and the Road and Bridge Department for their assistance with their new building. Possible sources of revenue were discussed.

Annie Weber, Public Health Nurse, presented the State Nursing Expanded Budget proposal and requested the Commissioners' support.

Diane Neal, District Clerk of Court, presented a Child Support Cooperative agreement for signature. It was moved by Commissioner Skinner and seconded by Commissioner Bousman to sign the agreement.

Bob Maxam, representing the Wyoming Highway Department, presented a letter concerning the paved roads in the County. The Board requested a letter be sent to A. V. DeBernardi, District Engineer, informing him that the County considers Fremont Lake County Road No. 23-154, first priority, and Ehman Lane County Road No. 23-144 as second priority for the coming year, and possibly as a combined project. Maxam reported on the new New Fork Lake Road easement and an early spring letting was suggested.

In accordance with the notice published in the Pinedale Roundup on December 3 and 10, 1987, public hearing was held for an application for a planning grant to study the Union Pass Road, on behalf of the Council of Governments. The hearing was attended by 24 concerned citizens, generally supportive of the proposal. It was moved by Commissioner Skinner and seconded by Commissioner Tomassi to adopt Resolution No. 87-162T authorizing an application to the Economic Development and Stabilization Board for a planning grant to study the Union Pass Road. The motion carried, with Commissioner Bousman absent.
