

## OFFICIAL COUNTY COMMISSIONER PROCEEDINGS OCTOBER 4, 1988

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on this date at 9:00 a.m. with Louie Tomassi, Monte Skinner, Mike McGinnis, Commissioner Floyd Bousman was absent, but will be present for the afternoon session.

The minutes of the preceding regular meeting of September 6, 1988, were approved and ordered filed on motion by Commissioner Skinner and seconded by Commissioner Tomassi. The motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Skinner and seconded by Commissioner Tomassi to delay the opening of the sealed bids for a pick up until 1 p.m., when Commissioner Bousman will be present.

The official bonds for Eva C. Kallas, Director of Sexual Assault and Family Violence of Sublette County, in the amount of \$20,000; Lois Cobb, Secretary-Assistant Treasurer for the Sublette County Recreation Board, in the amount of \$10,000; Frances T. Jackson, Secretary-Treasurer for the Sublette County Rural Health Care District, in the amount of \$5,000; and the approval of riders which extend the effective dates for Barbara J. Pape, William W. Cramer, Frank R. Dew, and Lois Koch, all of the Sublette County Rural Health Care District were approved and ordered filed with the appropriate County Official.

Dennis Allen of the Little Jennie Ranch, discussed a letter he sent to the Board concerning a cattleguard on Dell Creek County Road 23-114. Allen was referred to Mike McGinnis and the County Attorney and directed to return later in the day with an agreement concerning this matter.

Bernard Scott, Program Coordinator for the Wyoming Technology Transfer Center, discussed the educational opportunities that have been provided to the Counties and informed the Board that the program is in need of funding and plans to approach WACO and WAM.

Mike McGinnis reported that the school section on the New Fork Lake Road has been reclaimed per the construction contract and inquired about the new state regulations requiring access for the public to public lands.

A permit allowing the location of utility distribution lines within the County road right of way was approved for Telephone Utilities of Wyoming on County Road No. 23-134 in Sections 17, 18, and 19, T29N, R111W, and to Utah Power & Light Company on County Road No. 23-122 in Section 10, T32N, R107W.

Ed DeLong, representing Sublette Community Counseling Service, reported on the progress of the program and its expansion of services in the area of drug and alcohol abuse. Amy Reed and Sharon Owsley, formerly of SWARA, have been hired to provide this service to the County, and additional funding has been received.

Buzz and June Wassenberg, representing the Joint Big Piney-Marbleton Volunteer fire Department, presented the bids received for the purchase of a new fire truck. The Joint Powers Board recommended the bid from Becker Fire Equipment Company and requested the Board pass a resolution to approve an application to the State of Wyoming for a Mineral Royalty Grant. It was moved by Commissioner Skinner and seconded by Commissioner Tomassi to adopt Resolution No. 88-196T approving the application for Mineral Royalty Funding from the State of Wyoming. The motion carried. Commissioner Bousman concurred with the decision upon his arrival. It was moved by Commissioner Skinner and seconded by Commissioner Tomassi to add \$15,000 to the FY90 budget for the Joint Big Piney-Marbleton Volunteer Fire Department for matching funds, if needed. The motion carried.

November 25, December 26, and January 2, were declared County holidays.

The Board reviewed the petition on Mary Anne Channell concerning the establishment of a private road in Section 4, T35N, R113W. Van Graham was present to represent the Bakers and requested that the viewing be set ahead to facilitate time for negotiation. The County Clerk was directed to contact three viewers and set the viewing for October 25th at 10 a.m. It was moved by Commissioner Skinner and seconded by Commissioner Tomassi to sign the order. The motion carried.

Arlan Hinter, new Area Manager for the BLM, presented the deed for the Marbleton Landfill. The fence on the New Fork Lake Road was discussed. The Board was informed that the BLM will issue the permit contingent on providing access to the property owners in the subdivision and that the fence will be constructed to BLM standards.

A letter from Peter Flanigan was presented regarding the cost of relocation of the Lander Cutoff County Road No. 23-132. Janet Montgomery was directed to prepare a resolution authorizing application to the BLM for additional right of way and present the resolution later in the day.

Hank Ruland, Bob Sutherland, and Rhonda Griggs of the Sheriff's Department, informed the Board that the University of Wyoming could not provide any additional information concerning the costliness of operating the County Jail and referred the Department to the State Statutes. The present staff of two people in the jail was discussed and Commissioner Tomassi informed them that there is no moratorium on hiring and that five positions are budgeted for jailors.

Jim and Margaret Noble discussed the New Fork Lake Road and the public access to the school section on the road. It was decided to contact Howard Schrinar, the Commissioner of Public Lands, by telephone to receive clarification on the type of access required.

Judy Bogle and Martha Ptasnik presented the lease agreement for the Learning Center. The agreement was signed.

It was noted that Commissioner Bousman is present for the remainder of the meeting.

It was moved by Commissioner Skinner and seconded by Commissioner Bousman to accept the letter from Peter Flanigan stating that he will bear the cost of relocation of the Lander Cutoff County Road No. 23-132 and that the road will be reconstructed to County Road Standards.
