

## OFFICIAL COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS AUGUST 7, 1990

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on this date at 9:00 a.m. with Louie Tomassi, Monte Skinner, Craig Crandall, Dave Arambel of the Pinedale Roundup, and Mary Lankford, County Clerk present.

The minutes of the public hearing to solicit public input on the proposed revision of the Forest Service Travel Management Plan of July 16, 1990, and preceding meetings of July 3, 16, and 17, 1990, were approved and ordered filed on motion by Commissioner Skinner and seconded by Commissioner Crandall. The motion carried.

The official bonds for Rex Poulson, Treasurer for the Sublette County Library Board, in the amount of \$4,000; Robert Lonzo, Treasurer for School District #9, in the amount of \$50,000; and Valeria M. Pierson, Treasurer for the Pinedale Airport Board, in the amount of \$1,000 were approved and ordered filed with the County Treasurer.

Sealed bids for the excavation of the cell at the Marbleton Landfill were opened and read by Commissioner Tomassi. Bids were received from Schmid Sand & Gravel, Skyline Construction, and Shamrock Construction. It was moved by Commissioner Crandall and seconded by Commissioner Skinner to award the bid to Schmid Sand & Gravel for the amount of \$.82 per cubic yard for excavation and \$.54 per cubic yard to stockpile topsoil. The motion carried.

Jeannie Norman of the Pinedale Area Chamber of Commerce discussed the transient merchant law in relation to ~~bed~~ Rendezvous. The matter was referred to John Crow, County and Prosecuting Attorney, to pursue.

Larry Deats of Wyoming Machinery and Mike Satterfield of S & S Machinery presented proposals for the lease-purchase of two motorgraders. After discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Skinner and seconded by Commissioner Crandall to hold the proposals until September 4th. The motion carried.

Ray Bredthauer discussed the zoning of a tract of land and was referred to the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Mike McGinnis informed the Board that the bridge in the stock driveway at Forty Rod County Road needed repair and was directed to make the appropriate repairs by October 15th.

Kayo Bucho discussed Club House County Road No. 23-218 and was informed that road improvements will be made after the water and sewer project is completed.

It was moved by Commissioner Crandall and seconded by Commissioner Skinner to accept the Whelen Bridge right of way from the BLM. The motion carried.

Commissioner Tomassi signed applications for temporary use during construction for the BLM and gravel for fill on the Whelen Bridge project from the BLM.

It was moved by Commissioner Crandall and seconded by Commissioner Skinner to adopt Resolution No. 90-268T ~~dec~~ declaring Whelen Bridge County Road No. 23-222 a county road. The motion carried and the plat was signed.

It was moved by Commissioner Skinner and seconded by Commissioner Crandall to issue utility crossing permits to Vantage Cable on Orcutt Hill and to Northwest Pipeline. The motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Skinner and seconded by Commissioner Crandall to sign the plat for Rim Road #2-Hoback Ranches. The motion carried. The County Clerk was instructed to delay recording the plat until the appropriate easements have been filed.

It was moved by Commissioner Crandall and seconded by Commissioner Skinner to issue a malt beverage permit to the Southwest Softball Association for August 11 and 12, 1990, for a softball tournament. The motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Skinner and seconded by Commissioner Crandall to adopt Resolution No. 90-264T to purchase and authorize the County Clerk to pay for the E $\frac{1}{2}$ S $\frac{1}{2}$ , Block 1, Cooley First Addition to the Town of Pinedale. The motion carried.

Sheriff Jack Cain presented the Metro contracts for signature, but was informed that the appropriate resolutions must be signed first and was requested to return with the resolutions.

Kevin Coulter and John Blaha discussed the construction of the Daniel Fire Hall. It was moved by Commissioner Crandall and seconded by Commissioner Skinner to approve the plans and advertise for bids. The motion carried.

Bill Twichell presented the petition for the Mosquito Abatement District #2 formation. The petition was ~~dec~~ accepted by the Board and public hearing was scheduled for September 4, 1990.

Bob McElhose, Director of Sublette Community Counseling informed the Board of current activities.
