

OFFICIAL COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS
OCTOBER 1, 1991

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on this date at 9:00 a.m. with Craig Crandall, Buzz Wassenberg, Dave Arambel of the Pinedale Roundup, Mike McGinnis, John Crow, and Mary Lankford, County Clerk present. Commissioner Monte Skinner was absent.

The minutes of the preceding meetings of August 27 and September 3, 1991, were approved and ordered filed on motion by Commissioner Wassenberg and seconded by Commissioner Crandall. The motion carried.

The official bonds for Shirley Bray, Director of the Southwest Sublette County Pioneers, in the amount of \$1,000, and Tharon Greenwood, Secretary-Treasurer for the Sublette County Rural Health Care District, in the amount of \$5,000, were approved and ordered filed with the County Treasurer.

Sue Wells of Utah Power & Light Company, discussed the transmission line across the approach to the new Whelan Bridge and the reduction in distance between the line and the bridge. Wells was informed that the Wyoming Highway Department designed and supervised the bridge project. John Crow was directed to contact the Highway Department regarding the situation and the estimated \$17,054.00 required to remedy the clearance problem.

Annie Weber, Public Health Nurse, inquired if Sheriff Jack Cain had responded to the Board concerning a letter sent from the Child Protection Team regarding an attempted suicide. Weber was informed that Sheriff Cain had not responded to the Board, as of this date.

Marla Vicchy, Public Health Nurse, informed the Board that Public Health will be providing radon education to the citizens of Sublette County and provided information concerning the program. The Board requested that the County facilities be tested.

The Board signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Sublette County Weed and Pest District for the use of the building at Big Piney.

Mike McGinnis presented the Highway Department plans for the Jack Creek and Dell Creek bridges. The Board discussed the dust control projects and directed McGinnis to continue the dust control projects near the towns.

It was moved by Commissioner Wassenberg and seconded by Commissioner Crandall to adopt Resolution NO. 91-320C prohibiting the use of County property by transient merchants. The motion carried. The County Clerk was directed to notify the appropriate Boards.

John Mortenson discussed the need for additional services concerning the FY91 audit, which required additional fees. After discussion with the County Clerk and County Treasurer, payment of the additional fees were approved.

Pat Kirol, Dorothy Orgill, and Sue Woodson, of the Hi-Country Senior Citizens, informed the Board that their budget receipts were over estimated in the budget process, and that their final budget is approximately \$12,000 short. The Senior Citizens have been notified that they will be responsible for the payment of a two-year audit, which has not been budgeted. The Board decided to pay for the audit from the building fund; however, it could not commit to providing the funding for the shortfall.

In accordance with the public notice published in the Pinedale Roundup on August 14, 22, 29, and September 5, 1991, for Country Lane Groceries & Gas, and August 29, September 5, 12, and 19, 1991, for Lakeside Lodge and Hoback Village, public hearing was held for the issuance of a Retail Liquor License. No objections were filed on the applications. The final hearing for the issuance of the license will be held on November 5, 1991.

Undersheriff Bob Hanson and Sgt. Bob Sutherland discussed the sheriff's policy regarding overtime. In various situations, overtime has and has not been paid. The Board directed the County Clerk to schedule Sheriff Cain for the October 15th meeting.

It was moved by Commissioner Wassenberg and seconded by Commissioner Crandall to declare the civil defense position vacant, as of October 15, 1991, and appoint Bob Looney acting director until a permanent director can be hired. The motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Wassenberg and seconded by Commissioner Crandall to adopt Resolution No. 91-321C fixing a time and place for hearing on a petition to establish the Boulder Lake Improvement District. The motion carried.
