OFFICIAL COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS
JANUARY 6, 1998

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on this date at 9:00 a.m. with Buzz Wassenberg, Bill Cramer, Gordon Johnston, Dave Trombly, Jim Hutchinson, Cat Urbigkit of the Pinedale Roundup, Mike McGinnis, and Mary Lankford, County Clerk present.

The minutes of the preceding meeting of December 16, 1997, were approved and ordered filed on motion by Commissioner Cramer and seconded by Commissioner Johnston. The motion carried.

The official bonds for John V. Crow, County Court Judge, in the amount of \$5,000, and Jacqueline A. Ingersoll, Clerk of County Court, in the amount of \$5,000, were approved and ordered filed with the Clerk of District Court.

Daphne Platts, County Librarian, and Jerry Wilson of the Sublette County Library Board, discussed expansion of the Library Board, in response to a petition from five citizens in Bondurant. Platts informed the Board that their by-laws would require the Board to be expanded to five members with county-wide representation, and commented that the current three-member board works well. Wilson reported that the Library Board had not reviewed the expansion proposal, and would like the opportunity to do so at its next meeting, and make a recommendation to the County. Wilson requested that the current vacancy on the Board be filled by Florence Perry.

Mike McGinnis, Road & Bridge Superintendent, reported on landfill operations, informed the Board of the need to advertise the transfer contract in the next few months, discussed the Peterson Hill project, and discussed the possible expansion of the Horse Creek Snowmobile Parking Lot.

A letter from Vivian Brannan concerning installing a road sign at the corner of Valley Road and N. Quaker Lane was discussed and the Board decided to tour the area during their lunch break.

Jerry and Elaine Tully, Dr. Brent Dean, Mike Grove, Van Huffman, Mary Skinner, Mark Biffle, and Boyd Anderson discussed the abandonment of the Pole Creek Stock Driveway. Paul Scherbel described the current driveway and ways to preserve an easement in the area. Chairman Wassenberg questioned the easement for the powerline, and if abandoning the easement would eliminate the power easement. Wassenberg was advised that the powerline has its own easement.
