

Annie Weber, Public Health Nurse, presented the budget forms required by the State of Wyoming for the public health program for signature. Commissioner Johnston signed the forms. Weber presented a check from the State of Wyoming from Medicare for \$3,569.00. Weber discussed the use of Health Fair funds for programs which promote health and safety through immunization clinics. Currently, sunglasses and bicycle helmets are available for children. The Board agreed to Weber's discretionary use of the Health Fair funds.

Mike McGinnis, Road and Bridge Superintendent, presented the engineer's estimate for the reconstruction of Stone Trail and Granite Lane. The estimate, with all materials supplied by the contractor, is \$328,555.00, and with the County providing materials to be placed by the contractor, is \$227,104.00. It was moved by Commissioner Fear and seconded by Commissioner Johnston to table action on the proposal until the next meeting on August 17th. McGinnis reported on proposed repairs to eliminate ice and promote drainage at Dele Ball's, repair to the chip-seal on Ehman Lane, and archeology on Middle Piney. Road and Transfer Station complaints were discussed. The Board discussed the DEQ closure report for the Boulder, Pinedale, and Daniel landfills. McGinnis reviewed the bridge report. McGinnis reported on the Swain fishing access.

Sheriff Hank Ruland and Undersheriff Henry Schmidt reported that the Law Enforcement Metro Contracts are with the towns for signature. Schmidt reported that Four Winds Adventure Company will be in Sublette County beginning August 14th and have requested search and rescue support for their event.

It was moved by Commissioner Fear and seconded by Commissioner Johnston to issue a malt beverage permit to the Sublette County Fair Board for the rodeo on August 6th and the Fairgrounds. The motion carried.

County Attorney Dale Aronson requested permission to provide pro bono legal service for a termination and adoption. It was moved by Commissioner Fear and seconded by Commissioner Johnston to allow Aronson to provide pro bono legal service for an uncontested adoption. The motion carried.

Bob Reese, District Ranger, reported on the Green River Lakes Meeting scheduled for September 9 and 10, release of the decision document for two sheep allotments in the southern Wind River Range, New Fork Lake post and pole sale, Union Pass blow-down areas, landscape analysis, completion of the Travel Plan closures, grizzly bear activity in the Upper Green River, road repairs, the Union Pass scoping document, and repairs to the Darwin Ranch Road.

Prill Mecham, Acting Field Manager for the BLM, reported on the bid tour for the Green River log jams project at Warren Bridge, archeology on the Pinedale Pathway, public hearing for the Pinedale Anticline, transportation planning for the Anticline area, timber sale in western Sublette County, removal of the Boulder Lake boat dock for repairs, and new personnel at the local BLM office.

A sealed bid was opened for the purchase of a sport utility vehicle for the County Assessor's Office. After review of the bid, it was moved by Commissioner Johnston and seconded by Commissioner Fear to reject the bid and readvertise. The motion carried.
