OFFICIAL COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS
AUGUST 17, 1999

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on this date at 9:00 a.m. at the Marbleton County Annex in the County Court Room, with Bill Cramer, Gordon Johnston, Betty Fear, Cat Urbigkit of the Pinedale Roundup, Rob Shaul of the Sublette County Journal, and Mary Lankford, County Clerk present.

The minutes of the preceding meeting of August 3, 1999, were ordered filed on motion by Commissioner Johnston and seconded by Commissioner Fear. The motion carried.

The official bonds were approved for Patricia Bean, Director of the Sublette County Sexual Assault and Family Violence, in the amount of \$20,000, and Gerald Bruce Wilson, Treasurer for the Library Board, in the amount of \$4,000, and were ordered filed with the County Treasurer.

Representatives from the Fire Board discussed the County's current property and casualty insurance for the Fire Department buildings and equipment. After discussion, the Board directed the County Clerk to obtain a proposal to upgrade the current coverage.

Leslie Swank, Director of The Pinedale Preschool, reviewed the program's funding and repair needs. After discussing the reduction in the Community Service Block Grant of approximately \$8,000, it was moved by Commissioner Johnston and seconded by Commissioner Fear to transfer \$11,000 for The Pinedale Preschool, with \$8,000 for scholarships to replace lost funding, and \$3,000 for floor repairs. The motion carried.

The Board reviewed the engineer's estimates on the Granite Lane-Stone Trail Project. Commissioner Johnston declared a conflict of interest. Lois Decker and Ken Konicek discussed the costs with the Board. The Board directed Mike McGinnis to schedule the work of upgrading the roads to County specifications for this fall, weather permitting, to be ready for the application of inverted pen in the spring of 2000.

Ken Konicek, of Tegeler and Associates, reviewed the County's health insurance policy and renewal rates. Negotiations on rates are still ongoing with the provider. Konicek will provide a final rate schedule at the next meeting.

Gregg Anderson, representing the Rural Health Care District, requested assistance from the Road and Bridge Department with removal of existing surfacing for parking lot improvements at the County Clinics. The Board approved the request and advised Anderson to contact McGinnis within a week to ten days before the project begins.

Road and Bridge items discussed were: slick hill on the Industrial Site Road, the west end of Forty Rod Road, and the access to the Boulder Firehouse and School and a caving culvert which belongs to the Wyoming Department of Transportation.

Commissioner Johnston reported that he had visited the Pinedale Transfer Station on an extremely busy day, and the operation was clean and efficient.

The law enforcement metro contract for Pinedale was presented. It was moved by Commissioner Johnston and seconded by Commissioner Fear to sign the Pinedale contract. The motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Johnston and seconded by Commissioner Fear to approve the request from School District #1 for leave for Jim Malkowski and Cathy Saxton to attend a Wyoming School Boards Association workshop in Cheyenne on August 16th. The motion carried.
