

McGinnis expressed his objection to the location of the Pinedale Pathway within the County's right of way.

In accordance with W.S. 12-4-104(a), the Board held a public hearing for the transfer of a County Retail Malt Beverage Permit from Elk Ridge Lodge, Inc. to Green River Lodge, Inc. for Elk Ridge Lodge. There being no objections, it was moved by Commissioner Fear and seconded by Commissioner Johnston to approve the transfer. The motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Fear and seconded by Commissioner Johnston to issue a malt beverage permit to the Pinedale Snow Explorers for a Grass Drag Race on September 8, 2001, west of Pinedale. The motion carried.

Sheriff Hank Ruland, Undersheriff Henry Schmidt, and Emergency Management Coordinator Tom Hueckstaedt presented for signature the Wyoming Emergency Management Memorandum of Understanding and Assurances, discussed a lease agreement with Pape Ranches to locate a communications building on Aspen Ridge, and proposed remodeling and repairs of the Marbleton Annex.

John Topper, representing the Yellowstone Development District, informed the Board that the next District meeting will be in Sublette County on August 30th, and discussed the County's continued participation in the District. Sublette County is eligible for revolving funds through the District, which can be used by County businesses.

Todd Bishop, of Kaiser and Company, discussed the County's reserve accounts and possible investment and consolidation of funds. The Board decided to schedule a workshop with Bishop in September.

It was moved by Commissioner Fear and seconded by Commissioner Johnston to cancel the September 18th meeting, to allow the Board to attend the Wyoming Association of County Officers meeting in Rock Springs. The motion carried.

The Board recessed the meeting to travel to the Ag. Center, and reconvened the meeting to discuss the fire suppression system. Mike Quinn, of Quinn/Richardson/Kucera PC, Al Rood, Fire Prevention Specialist, Mike Harris, representing Firetrol, Tom Brown, Gary Espenscheid, John Fear, and the Board discussed the functioning of the fire suppression system. It was decided to activate the system and pursue its proper functioning.

Brad Waters and Dave Andersen discussed the Facilities Construction Project and reported that the foundation for the Courthouse Addition and the sally port for the Law Enforcement Building will be completed before winter. Fire prevention review by the State Fire Marshall's staff of the Detention Center plans was discussed. Waters discussed artwork for the new buildings.

Karla Holloway and Kathy Quintard, representing the Fair Board, requested an advance of funds for the Fair Board. It was moved by Commissioner Fear and seconded by Commissioner Johnston to advance \$25,000 to the Fair Board from the County's General Fund, to be replaced when tax funds are received. The motion carried.

Ken Konicek, representing Tegeler and Associates, presented the final renewal for the County's health insurance. It was moved by Commissioner Fear and seconded by Commissioner Johnston to renew the insurance, increase the life time cap to \$1.5 million, increase the ambulance benefits, and add a prescription drug card. The motion carried. The Board will discuss long-term disability and life insurance at the September 4th meeting.

The Board closed the meeting to the public for an Executive Session for a conference call with John McKinley of Davis and Cannon to discuss ongoing litigation.

The Board reopened the meeting.

It was moved by Commissioner Fear and seconded by Commissioner Johnston to adopt Resolution No. 01-706C establishing Pinedale South County Road No. 23-123, Granite Lane County Road No. 23-205, and Stone Trail County Road No. 23-216 as arterial streets with a 20 mile-per-hour speed limit. The motion carried.
