

## AFFIDAVIT

THE STATE OF <sup>Montana</sup> WYOMING,County of Lake SS.

Adolph Kopp, Jr., being first duly sworn on oath, deposes and says:  
 That he is Adolph Kopp, Jr., of Swan Lake, Montana, a citizen of U.S.A. & discoverer  
 of Lucky Strike number two lode claim situated in the Sublette  
County, Bridger National Forest, Wyoming

; that ~~on~~ the  
27 day of September, 1955,  
 performed the discovery work on said lode claim by planting tinplate of claims with plainly marked  
monuments & digging discovery hole showing ledge containing minerals described  
on reverse side;

which discovery work is located approx 75 yds North-Northwest of from east side center  
monument & about 10 ft from monument dated Aug 10th 1955 by a point  
from Lander, Wyoming; note that hole for L.S. #1 was adjacent to monument of  
L.S. #1 and was mistakenly described as this hole within said claim; and that the nature  
 of the minerals discovered on said claim are, viz: Sedimentary Uranium, Chromium, & associated  
minerals in phosphatic limestones, sandstones, shales & other phosphatic rock

Section 57-917, Wyoming Compiled Statutes, 1945, as amended, "\*\*\*\* The drilling of such hole, or holes, or the sinking of the shaft or making of the discovery pit otherwise provided for in this Act shall be made a matter of record by the recording in the office of the County Clerk of the county in which the claim shall be situated the affidavit or sworn statement of the discoverer, locator, owner or his or their agents stating the date of such work, the nature thereof, the person or persons by whom performed, the location of such work within the claim, and the nature of the mineral discovered. Such affidavit may be a part of the location certificate to be thereafter recorded in accordance with the provisions of this Act. \*\*\*\*"
