Section 57-917, Wyoming Compiled Statutes, 1945, as amended, "\*\*\*\*The drilling of such hole, or holes, or the sinking of the shaft or making of the discovery pit otherwise provided for in this Act shall be made a matter of record by the recording in the office of the County Clerk of the county in which the claim shall be situated the affidavit or sworn statement of the discoverer, locator, owner or his or their agents stating the date of such work, the nature thereof, the person or persons by whom performed, the location of such work within the claim, and the nature of the mineral discovered. Such affidavit may be a part of the location certificate to be thereafter recorded in accordance with the provisions of this Act.\*\*\*\*"
