

And it appearing that said account is in all respects true and correct, and that it is supported by proper vouchers; that the residue of money in the hands of the administrator at the time of filing said account was two thousand nine hundred ninety-five and 01/100 Dollars, that since the rendition of said account there has been no money received by said administrator, that the sum of ten and 50/100 Dollars has been expended by him as necessary expenses of administration; that the estimated expenses of closing the estate will amount to the sum of fourteen hundred twenty-five and 80/100 Dollars, the statutory allowance for administrators fee and attorney's fee, leaving a residue of fifteen hundred fifty-eight and 71/100 Dollars;

And it appearing that all claims and debts against said decedent, all taxes on said estate, and all debts, expenses and charges of administration, have been fully paid and discharged, and that said estate is ready for distribution and in condition to be closed;

It is therefore, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED, and this does ORDER, ADJUDGE AND DECREE, that the said final account of the said Administrator be and the same is settled, allowed and approved, and that the residue of said estate hereinafter particularly described, and any other property not now known or discovered which may belong to the said estate, or in which the said estate may have any interest, be, and the same is hereby distributed as follows, to-wit:

The one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of said residue to the said Frank D. Ball, the widower of said deceased, and the other half of said residue to Walter C. Ball, Alice Ball Newcomb and Frank D. Ball, Jr., the descendants of said deceased; that is to say, that the sum of \$779.35 be paid to said Frank D. Ball, and the sum of \$259.78 be paid to said Walter C. Ball, and the like sum to Alice Ball Newcomb and the like sum to Frank D. Ball Jr; and one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the United States Coupon Bonds to the said Frank D. Ball, and the other half of said Bonds to Walter C. Ball, Alice Ball Newcomb and Frank D. Ball Jr., said bonds being of the par value of \$10,250.00.

The equal undivided half part of the real estate is hereby distributed to said Frank D. Ball, and the other equal undivided half part of the real estate to the said descendants of said deceased; to the said Walter C. Ball, one undivided one sixth; to the said Alice Ball Newcomb, one undivided one sixth; and to the said Frank D. Ball Jr., one undivided one sixth of the whole of the real estate hereinafter mentioned and described.

The following is a particular description of the said residue of said estate referred to in this decree and of which distribution is now ordered, as aforesaid, to-wit:

The west-half of the southeast quarter ( $W\frac{1}{2}SE\frac{1}{4}$ ) and the east-half of the southwest quarter ( $E\frac{1}{2}SW\frac{1}{4}$ ) and the south-east quarter of the northwest quarter ( $SE\frac{1}{4}NW\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section two (2), the north-half of the northeast quarter ( $N\frac{1}{2}NE\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section eleven (11), in Township thirty-one (31) North of Range One Hundred Eleven (111) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Wyoming, containing two hundred eighty acres. Together with all water rights and improvements.
