That for a valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the undersigned hereby assigns and transfers to B. E. Taylor, and his assigns, the said royalty interest of Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00), payable at the rate of seventeen (17%) per cent of oil and gas produced upon the above described land. It is understood that the first mentioned assignment herein reserved to the said Utah LaBarge Oil Company a royalty of two and one-half (2 $\frac{1}{2}$ %) per cent of all oil and gas produced and saved from said land, in addition to said royalty of said Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00), but that the said royalty of two and one-half per cent is not hereby assigned and transferred but is retained by the undersigned Utah LaBarge Oil Company.

THIS AGREEMENT, Made and entered into this 4th day of January, 1926, by and between The Denver LaBarge Oil and Gas Company, hereinafter called the "Owner", the party of the first part, and Lee A. Crow, hereinafter called the "Contractor," the party of the second part, WITNESSETH:

THAT, WHEREAS, On or about the 18th day of September, 1925, pursuant to an application therefor, there was issued to the Owner, under Section 13, of the Act of February 25, 1920 (41 Stat. 437), a permit, Serial No. 09254, Evanston, Wyoming land office series granting to it the exclusive right for a period of two years from the date thereof, to prospect for oil and gas, the following described lands, situate in the so-called "La Barge" Oil Field, in Sublette County, Wyoming, to-wit:
