THIS ROYALTY ASSIGNMENT, dated at Salt Lake City, Utah this 18th day of July, 1927, provides as follows:

THAT WHEREAS, R. C. Horn is the holder of a certain royalty assignment dated at Salt Lake City, Utah, February 6th, 1927, and signed by Lionel H. Gray, Grace Gray Snelgrove and Hazel Gray Snelgrove, and reading as follows:

"For and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar in hand paid, and other good and valuable consideration, We, LIONEL H. GRAY, of Salt Lake City, Utah, and GRACE GRAY SNELGROVE and HAZEL GRAY SNELGROVE, of Hermosa Beach California, sole heirs of Carrie Gray, deceased, owner of Oil and Gas Prospecting Permit #07697, Evanston, embracing lands in the Piney LaBarge Oil Field, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

W $\frac{1}{2}$  Sec. 3; W $\frac{1}{2}$  Sec. 10; all Sec. 22 except SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ ; N $\frac{1}{2}$ , NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ , Sec. 23; SE $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 24; W $\frac{1}{2}$ , SE $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 25, Twp. 28 N., R. 113 W., 6th P. M. Wyoming, containing 2239.12 acres;

do hereby assign, set over and transfer to R. C. Horn, 1027 First National Bank Building, Denver, Colorado, an undivided over-riding royalty of one and one-quarter per cent (1 $\frac{1}{4}$ %) in and to all of the Oil and Gas produced on the preferential one-fourth of an acreage in such Permit, and one-and one-quarter per cent (1 $\frac{1}{4}$ %) in and to all of the oil and gas produced on the secondary three-fourths of the acreage of said Permit, which royalties shall be over and above the royalties payable to the United States of America and subject to the usual and customary royalty provisions."

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration to him in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said R. C. Horn does hereby sell and assign unto V. E. Soderquist of Denver Colorado, an undivided over-riding royalty of One-Sixteenth of One percent (1/16%) in and to all the oil and Gas produced on the preferential one-fourth of an acreage in such Permit, and one-sixteenth of one per cent (1/16%) in and to all of the oil and gas produced on the secondary three-fourths of the acreage of said Permit, as provided in the above mentioned assignment.
