

DEGREE OF SETTLEMENT OF FINAL ACCOUNT AND DISTRIBUTION

GEORGE W. HOPKINS, JR. administrator of the estate of GEORGE W. HOPKINS, SENIOR, deceased, having on and before the 3rd day of March, 1939, rendered and filed herein a full account and report of his administration of said estate, which said account was for a final settlement, and having with said account filed a petition for the final distribution of said estate, and said account and petition this day coming on to be heard and proof having been made to the satisfaction of the court that the Clerk had given notice of the settlement of said account and the hearing of said petition in the manner and for the time required by law, the court finds:

1.

That said account is in all respects true and correct and that the whole of said estate consists of real property only, and that no funds whatsoever have been received by said administrator.

2.

That due and legal notice to creditors of said estate and of said decedent has been given in the manner and for the time required by law.

3.

That all claims against said decedent and against said estate, all inheritance taxes, if any due, and that all debts, taxes, expenses and charges of administration have been fully paid and discharged, by said administrator without resorting to the sale of the property belonging to said estate, and that said estate is now ready for distribution and in condition to be closed.

4.

That said George W. Hopkins, Senior, died intestate leaving him surviving the following named heirs at law who are entitled to share in the residue of the estate of said decedent, as hereinafter described and remaining for distribution, to-wit:

That the said Kate Hopkins Nichols, daughter and one of the above mentioned surviving heirs at law of said decedent, died on or about the 16th day of September, 1938, and that no administrator or executor of her estate has ever been appointed; and

That the said Nina Hopkins Thatcher, daughter and one of the above mentioned surviving heirs at law of said decedent, died on or about the 17th day of March, 1938, and that no administrator or executor of her estate has ever been appointed.

It is therefore CONSIDERED, ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED by the Court, that the final account of said administrator be, and the same is hereby finally settled, allowed and approved.

It is further CONSIDERED, ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED, and this does ORDER, ADJUDGE and DECREE, that the residue of the said estate of GEORGE W. HOPKINS, SENIOR, hereinafter particularly described, and now remaining in the hands of said administrator, and any other property which may belong to said estate, or in which said estate may have any interest be, and the same is hereby distributed, assigned, set over and absolutely vested according to law in the following named persons, and in the administrators or executors of such as are deceased, to-wit:

And To the administrator or executor of the estate of the said KATE HOPKINS NICHOLS, deceased, an undivided one-eighth part; and To the administrator or executor of the estate of the said NINA HOPKINS THATCHER, deceased, an undivided one-eighth part;

The following is a particular description of the said residue of the estate of GEORGE W. HOPKINS, SENIOR, deceased, referred to in this decree, and of which distribution is now ordered as aforesaid, to-wit:

The West-half of the Northeast quarter (W½NE¼), the Southeast quarter of the Northeast quarter (SE¼NE¼), and the Southeast quarter of the Northwest quarter (SE¼NW¼) of Section Fourteen (14) in Township Thirty-two (32) North of Range One Hundred Fourteen (114) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Wyoming, containing 160 acres, in Sublette County, Wyoming.
