Wherefore it is accordingly ordered, adjudged and decreed that the said option, plaintiffs' exhibit No. 7, being the instrument dated July 14th, 1943, and of record in the office of the County Clerk of Sublette county, Wyomin, in Book 9 of Miscellaneous records at page 389 is null and void and is hereby canceled and the plaintiffs be and hereby are awarded the possession of the lands and premises described in said option, being the south half of the southeast quarter of section four and the northeast quarter of section nine and the north half of the northwest quarter and the southeast quarter of the northwest quarter of section ten, all in township twenty nine north, of range one hundred thirteen west of the sixth principal meridian and in said Sublette County, State of Wyoming, and their titles thereto and to the oil and gas and other minerals therein and thereunder be and hereby are quieted in them against said defendant Hansel H. Howell and said defendant and his agents, servants and employees be and they hereby are enjoined and restfained from further drilling for or taking or removing oil or gas or other minerals from said premises or any thereof and that he forthwith surrender and deliver possession of said lands to the plaintiffs and

Plaintiffs have and recover from said defendant their costs in this action incurred to be taxed by the Clerk at \$146.75 and

To which judgment and decree and all thereof said defendant excepts.
