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In case said premises shall be rendered untenable by fire or unavoidable casualty, the Lessor may replace said building in as good condition as when damaged within ninety (90) days, and failing so to do or upon the destruction of the said premises by fire, the term hereby created shall cease and determine, provided, however, that the Lessees shall not be required to pay the rent while said building is untenable.

In consideration of the sum of One Dollar to him in hand paid, the Lessors herein agree that they will furnish good, sufficient and adequate heat for said premises and deliver the same to the heat radiators located in said demised building at their own expense and without expense to the Lessees as long as this lease shall remain in force and effect.

The parties hereto agree that the covenants and agreements herein contained shall extend to and be binding upon their respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns.


