DONALD W. ROGERS and NELLIE PATRICIA ROGERS, being first duly sworn upon their oaths, according to law, depose and say each for himself and herself:

That they are of adult ages and are husband and wife, and since the 1st day of December 1950, have been and now are the owners of the real property known and described as the

East One-half of the Northwest Quarter (E₁ NW₁) and the East One-half of the Southwest Quarter (E₁ SW₁), of Section Fourteen (14), Township Thirty-two (32) North, Range One Hundred Eight (108) West of the 6th Principal Meridian,

and situate in the County of Sublette, State of Wyoming, and that they are familiar with said lands and all thereof, and on various and frequent occasions since said date and up to the date hereof have been upon and over and have investigated all of said lands;

Under date of March 20, 1918, Charles Stuart and Gladys F. Stuart, former owners of said lands, executed to the Wyoming Empire Oil Company, as lessee, an Oil and Gas Lease covering said lands for the primary term of five years, which Lease is of record in the Office of the County Clerk and Ex-Officio Register of Deeds of Sublette County, State of Wyoming, in Book 3 of Mixed Records (Transcribed) at page 254;

That there is no evidence on said lands that any oil and gas well was ever drilled thereon and that no such operations have been conducted upon said lands, or any part thereof, at any time since affiants became the owners thereof, and that no person has had or claimed any right or possession under said Lease since affiants so became the owners of said lands, and that the term of said Oil and Gas Lease has not in any way been extended by affiants or either of them, and that said Lease has expired and is now null and void.
