That Jack Bickford Curtis died intestate on the 15th day of July, 1952, a resident of the State of Kansas owning an undivided one-third interest in the foregoing lands and real property and that all of his interest therein did upon his death descend to and vest in his heirs at law in equal undivided shares and that his heirs at law, and his only heirs at law, and their respective shares were as follows:

That more than two years have elapsed since the death of J. B. Curtis and Jack Bickford Curtis, and that no judicial determination of said decedent's heirs or of the right of descent of said decedents' interest in the foregoing lands and real property has been made a matter of public record.

WHEREFORE, it is Ordered, Adjudged, Decreed, Established and Determined that J. B. Curtis died intestate on the 30th day of November, 1941, and that Jack Bickford Curtis died intestate on the 15th day of July, 1952; that the heirs at law and only heirs at law, of J. B. Curtis were his children, Lillian Violet Curtis Milleg, Jack Bickford Curtis and William E. Curtis, in whom the foregoing lands and real property vested, in equal shares, upon his death; that the heirs at law and only heirs at law of Jack Bickford Curtis were his sisters, Lillian Violet Curtis Milleg, and his brother William E. Curtis, in whom all of the interest of Jack Bickford Curtis in the foregoing lands and real property vested upon his death, in equal shares, and that more than two years have elapsed since the deaths of J. B. Curtis and Jack Bickford Curtis.
