

LEGAL REQUIREMENTS FOR  
FILING CERTIFICATE OF DEATH

For deaths on which the medical certification is made by the physician in last attendance, Section 10401 of the Health and Safety Code requires that "The physician shall within 15 hours after the death deposit the certificate at the place of death, or deliver it to the attending funeral director at his place of business or at the office of the physician."

For deaths on which the coroner makes the certification, Section 10429 of the Health and Safety Code requires that "The coroner shall within three days after examining the body deliver the death certificate to the attending funeral director."
