

8. That on or about December 2, 1942, my Brother, Thomas Thompson, conveyed all his interest in the aforesaid partnership and ranching and livestock business to me, William D. Thompson;
9. That on or about November 2, 1946, my Brother, John L. Thompson, conveyed all his interest in the aforesaid partnership and ranching and livestock business to me, William D. Thompson;
10. That my Father, Joseph Thompson, Sr., was also known as Joseph Thompson, and that my Brother, Joseph Thompson, Jr., particularly, after the death of my Father, was also known as Joseph Thompson;
11. That I know, from my own personal knowledge:
 - (a) that the grantee designated as Joseph Thompson, in Patent dated February 14, 1913, and recorded on April 3, 1922, in Book 33, Page 449, in the office of the County Clerk of Sublette County, Wyoming, covering the following described lands:

In Township 29 North, Range 104
West of the 6th P.M.:

Section 8: $W\frac{1}{2}SE\frac{1}{4}$;
Section 17: $W\frac{1}{2}NE\frac{1}{4}$;

- was my Father, JOSEPH THOMPSON, SR., and one and the same person as the grantor designated as JOSEPH THOMPSON, SR., in deed dated May 5, 1922, and recorded on May 8, 1922, in Book 4, Page 451, in the office of the County Clerk of Sublette County, Wyoming, conveying the same lands;
- (b) that my Father was in possession of said lands from the date of the issuance of said Patent on February 14, 1913, until he conveyed same to me, William D. Thompson, and my Brothers, Thomas Thompson and John L. Thompson, by aforesaid described deed on May 5, 1922;
 - (c) that during said period from the issuance of said Patent on February 14, 1913, to the execution of said deed on May 5, 1922, no person, other than my Father, Joseph
