

copies of said publication for mailing to each of said 341  
defendants whose place of residence was known to affiant and  
caused said clerk to mail by registered mail with return receipt  
requested a copy of said publication addressed to each defendant  
at the last known place of residence shown and stated in said  
publication.

That each of the above named individual defendants whose  
addresses were known, were served by registered mail by the  
Clerk of the District Court with a Notice of Suit except Walter  
Schultz, Wholesale Distributing Company, whose Notice of Suit  
was returned undelivered for reason of insufficient address.

That the present address of Walter Schultz dba Wholesale  
Distributing Company and all of the other individual defendants  
whose addresses were not known at the filing of this action,  
namely, W. R. Heitz, Lawrence Z. Bess, J. L. Oliver, Dell  
Stewart and Orvel Peterson aka Arvel Peterson, remain unknown  
and cannot with reasonable diligence be ascertained.

That the unknown heirs and devisees of any of the above  
named individual defendants who may be deceased, are unknown  
and cannot with reasonable diligence be ascertained.

That it is not known whether or not any of the above named  
defendants are in the military service of the United States or  
serving with the forces of any nation with which the United  
States may be allied.

The cause is one of the actions mentioned in Rule 4 F,  
Wyoming Rules of Civil Procedure, in that it is an action  
brought by plaintiffs for the purpose of obtaining a decree  
declaring, determining and establishing the rights and interests  
of the plaintiffs and each and all of the defendants in certain  
real property, hereinafter described, and quieting title and  
interests of the plaintiffs as established against the claims  
and demands of the defendants herein; that additional notice to  
the defendants, and each of them, is not justified nor required,  
and the requirements of Rule 4 of the Rules of Civil Procedure  
have been met and fully discharged.
