THIS ASSIGNMENT, Made this 20th day of May, A. D. 1932, by and between Utah Oil Refining Company, a Utah corporation, hereinafter called the "grantor", and Henry C. Tasker, Sarah C. Tasker, Elizabeth T. Gallagher, Mary E. Thompson, Thomas T. Tasker, Charles P. Tasker and J. E. Bramwell, as successors in interest of Charles P. Tasker, hereinafter collectively called the "grantees", WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, on August 12, A. D. 1925, the Secretary of the Interior issued to Charles P. Tasker under Serial No. Evanston 07788, an oil and gas prospecting permit covering the following described land in the County of Sublette and State of Wyoming:

North half (N $\frac{1}{2}$), Southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 15; all Section 22, Township 27 North, Range 113 West of 6th P.M., and

WHEREAS, on the 4th day of February, A. D. 1924, in anticipation of the issuance of said prospecting permit, the said Charles P. Tasker entered into an operating agreement with the grantor herein covering said land, and

WHEREAS, thereafter and on the 11th day of August, A. D. 1928, the grantor herein entered into an agreement affecting a portion of said lands with E. B. Smith and H. E. Robinson, which agreement was amended by modification agreement between said last named parties dated December 22, A. D. 1928, and

WHEREAS, on December 31, 1925, the grantor entered into an agreement affecting a portion of said lands with William Story, Jr., which agreement is modified by an agreement dated July 31, 1930, between the grantor herein and William MacArthur Story, and

WHEREAS, the grantees herein, by and through their attorney in fact, have demanded the grantor surrender and relinquish all its right, title and interest in and to said operating agreement of February 4, A. D. 1924, and in consideration thereof have offered to release the grantor from any duties, obligations or liabilities whatsoever under said operating agreement, or on account of said release;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises the grantor does hereby remise, release, surrender and forever quit claim unto the grantees and to their heirs, personal representatives and assigns, all of the right, title and interest, claim and demand of any nature whatsoever, which the grantor now has in and to the above described oil and gas prospecting permit, and in and to the operating agreement between the parties hereto dated February 4, A. D. 1924, as well as all right, title or interest of any nature whatsoever secured and reserved to the grantor herein and now owned by it by, through and under any of the other agreements hereinabove enumerated, made by the grantor affecting said prospecting permit or the land embraced therein.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD unto the grantees, their heirs, personal representatives and assigns free of any right, title or interest, claim or demand of the grantor, of any nature whatsoever.
