ASSIGNMENT OF OVERRIDING ROYALTY

This Assignment, made and entered into this 9th day of June, 1952, by and between Donald B. Anderson and Patricia Gaylord Anderson, his wife, of Roswell, New Mexico, hereinafter referred to as Assignors and Blue Royalties, Inc., hereinafter referred to as Assignee;

W I T N E S S E T H:

The undersigned Assignors for and in consideration of the sum of \$10.00 and other good and valuable consideration in hand paid by Assignee to Assignors the receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged, do hereby sell, assign, transfer, set over and convey unto said Assignee, its successors and assigns, an overriding royalty equal to one percent (1%) of the market value at the wells as produced of all the oil and gas which may be produced, saved and marketed from the following described lands under the terms of the following described Oil and Gas Lease or any extensions or renewals thereof or any lease based thereon; said lands and said lease being described as follows, to-wit:

That certain Oil and Gas Lease dated June 1, 1951 made and entered into by the United States of America as Lessor and Donald B. Anderson as Lessee bearing Wyoming Serial Number 06270, covering the following described lands situated in Sublette County, Wyoming:

T. 31 N., R. 109 W., Sec. 1 Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, S/2NW/4, NW/4SW/4; Sec. 2 All; Sec. 3 All; Sec. 9 S/2SE/4; Sec. 10 W/2, NE/4, NW/4SE/4; Sec. 11 N/2NW/4; Sec. 12 Lots 6, 7, 8, 10, S/2SE/4, NE/4SE/4, SE/4SW/4,

containing 2535.95 acres, m/l.

Said overriding royalty shall be computed and paid at the same time and in the same manner as royalties payable to the United States of America under the terms of said lease are computed and paid and the Assignee shall be responsible for Assignee's proportionate part of all taxes and assessments levied upon or against or measured by the production of oil or gas therefrom. The creation of this said overriding royalty shall not imply any leasehold preservation or development obligation on the part of the Assignors. However, nothing
