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Section 2. For the purpose of measurement, the absolute atmospheric (barometric) pressure shall be agreed upon for each point of delivery hereunder. For meters of the orifice type, the following factors shall be given due consideration:

a. The temperature of the natural gas flowing through Buyer's meter shall be obtained by the use of a recording thermometer so installed by Buyer that it may properly record the temperature of such gas. The arithmetical average recorded temperature shall be used in computing volumes hereunder.

b. The specific gravity of the natural gas shall be determined by Buyer each three (3) months (joint tests if desired by Seller) on or as near the first of each three (3) months' period as practicable, by means of an Edwards type balance or by such other method as may be agreed upon by the parties hereto. Such test shall determine the specific gravity to be used in computations for the measurement of natural gas deliveries during such three (3) months' period.

Section 3. Seller shall be notified of and have the right to be represented at and to participate in all tests of gas delivered hereunder or of any equipment used in measuring or determining the nature or quality of such gas.

ARTICLE XI

Gasoline Content Tests

In the event Buyer should process the gas purchased hereunder in a gasoline plant, tests for the determination of gasoline content of such gas shall be made by Buyer and at Seller's option in
