Dear Mrs. Salli:

Under date of June 8, 1956 as per the letter attached hereto, we advised the present participants in the Hogsback Unit that we proposed to submit an application to the Geological Survey requesting approval to expand the boundaries of the said Unit Area to include therein land which, for the reasons set forth in our June 8th letter, should be made a part of the Hogsback Unit.

In this connection, our records indicate that you have leased the following described lands located in Lincoln County, Wyoming to the Trojan Oil and Gas Company who, as lessee, have committed their interest to the Hogsback Unit:

Township 26 North, Range 113 West, 6th P.M.

Section 7: SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$; E $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$

Section 8: S $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$

We enclose a copy of the Hogsback Unit Agreement and also eleven copies of a Consent Ratification and Joinder agreement. If you execute the latter documents, it will have the effect of committing your interest in the above-referred to lands to the Hogsback Unit Agreement. The enclosed Unit Agreement has been approved by the United States Geological Survey and is of the type commonly utilized in the Rocky Mountain Area.

If you are interested in becoming a party to the Hogsback Unit, please execute ten copies of the attached Consent agreement, have your signature notarized, and return the ten completed copies to this office in the enclosed self-addressed stamped envelope. We believe unitization works to the advantage of all parties concerned and it provides for a more orderly development of oil and gas.
