You are required to file either (1) evidence of having entered into an agreement with the unit operator for the development and operation of the subject lands under the terms and provisions of the approved unit agreement, or (2) a statement giving satisfactory reasons for your failure to enter into such agreement. If such statement is acceptable to the Geological Survey and the Operator, you may receive permission to operate independently with the requirement that such operations conform to the terms and provisions of the unit agreement.

Thirty days from date of this notice are allowed in which to furnish this further evidence.
