3. All the coal in the lands so patented, and to it, or persons authorized by it, the right to prospect for, mine, and remove the coal from the same upon compliance with the conditions and subject to the provisions and limitations of the Act of June 22, 1910, 36 Stat. 583; 30 U.S.C., secs. 83-85;
4. All the oil and gas in the lands so patented, and to it, or persons authorized by it, the right to prospect for, mine and remove such deposits from the same upon compliance with the conditions and subject to the provisions and limitations of the Act of July 17, 1914, 38 Stat. 509, as supplemented; 30 U.S.C. 121-124; and

SUBJECT TO:

1. Those rights for irrigation ditch purposes as have been granted to David H. Johnston, his successors or assigns, by permit Evanston 02438, and to Fremont Irrigation Company, its successors or assigns, by permit Wyoming 020645, under the Act of March 3, 1891, 26 Stat. 1101, as amended, 43 U.S.C. 946-949; and
2. Those rights for electric transmission line purposes as have been granted to Lincoln Service Corporation, its successors or assigns, by permit Wyoming 036810 under the Act of February 15, 1901, 31 Stat. 790, as amended, 43 U.S.C. 959.
