# The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS

Harry Steele and Roy Steele

are entitled to a Land Patent pursuant to the Act of September 26, 1968, 82 Stat. 870, for the following described land:

Sixth Principal Meridian, Wyoming

T. 33 N., R. 110 W.,

sec. 3, NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$  and S $\frac{1}{2}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ .

Containing 30 acres;

NOW KNOW YE, that there is, therefore, granted by the UNITED STATES unto the above named claimants the land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said land with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said claimants, their successors and assigns, forever;

EXCEPTING AND RESERVING TO THE UNITED STATES:

1. A right-of-way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States, Act of August 30, 1890, 43 U.S.C. 945;
2. All the coal in the land so patented, and to it, or persons authorized by it, the right to prospect for, mine, and remove the coal from the same upon compliance with the conditions and subject to the provisions and limitations of the Act of June 22, 1910, 30 U.S.C. 83-85; and
3. All the oil and gas in the land so patented, and to it, or persons authorized by it, the right to prospect for, mine and remove such deposits from the same upon compliance with the conditions and subject to the provisions and limitations of the Act of July 17, 1914, as supplemented, 30 U.S.C. 121-124.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, the undersigned authorized officer of the Bureau of Land Management, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of June 17, 1948 (62 Stat. 476), has, in the name of the United States, caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the Bureau to be hereunto affixed.

GIVEN under my hand, in Cheyenne, Wyoming the NINTH day of APRIL in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and SEVENTY-THREE and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and NINETY-SEVENTH.
