

- z. Home Occupation: An occupation or activity carried on by the immediate members of the family residing on the premises. (amended def.) Said occupation shall not be visible or noticeable from outside the walls of the building and shall be clearly incidental and secondary to the residential occupancy.
- nn. Open Space: Natural or open areas including parks, playgrounds, or recreation areas, but not including roads or parking areas.

CHAPTER II

Section 1. Zoning Districts.

Rural Mixed (RM): This district provides land for a mixture of uses which are compatible to the residents of the district and adjoining property owners.

Planned Unit Development (PUD): This district is an overlay district which provides a flexible procedure for tracts of land which are to be planned and developed as a whole; using a unified design, encouraging creative methods, and allowing a mixture of uses.

Section 3. Authorized Uses.

- b. In the Agricultural District (A-1):
 - (4) Home business.
- c. In the Residential District (R):
 - (2) Delete cluster or planned unit development and condominiums as they are covered by the PUD district.
- d. In the Rural Residential Districts (R-R), (R-R 5), (R-R 10), (R-R 20):
 - (3) Delete cluster or planned unit development and condominiums as they are covered by the PUD district.
- e. In the Mobile Home Park District (MH):
 - (3) Mini storage buildings for use of residents of the district.
- h. In the Recreational Service District (RS-1):
 - (7) Motels;
 - (8) Time share condominiums.
- i. In the Light Industrial District (I-L):
 - (9) Delete residential uses incidental to the principal industrial use. (This is already covered by #6).
 - (9) Airports;
 - (10) Heavy equipment sales;
 - (11) Sawmills and lumberyards;
 - (12) Oil field or mining equipment sales or service;
 - (13) Research facilities;
 - (14) Supply and service shops including plumbing, welding, electrical, and builders.
